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1832 Biltmore – no roof terraces or patios Haddington (1840 Biltmore St) – no roof terraces or patios Lehigh (2605 Adams Mill Rd) – no roof terraces or patios

<25 units	No roof terraces or patios
<25 units	No roof terraces or patios
<25 units	Do not have a roof deck.
<25 units	We don't.
25 – 49 units	No roof terraces or patios
25 – 49 units	We don't have a roof garden or roof terrace. We don't have the kind of roof that would allow that. The roof is only accessible by a steep vertical ladder. The only people who go there are roofers, satellite dish installers, and a/c unit inspectorsand Board members if they need to inspect some problem.
25 – 49 units	We have a roof deck that is available to all residents. There is no roof garden and there are no private areas.
25 – 49 units	[Our co-op] does not have any rooftop amenities.
25 – 49 units	[Our co-op] has a public wood roof deck but no roof garden. (We do have a beautiful garden on the ground bordering our building.)
25 – 49 units	Sorry, engineers say our roof won't hold up people. No roof area.
25 – 49 units	Our co-op does Not use the roof as public space. We had an engineering study done (more than twenty years ago) and learned that the construction of our roof would not support the additional weight of any deck or structure. Re- engineering the construction of our roof would be prohibitively expensive.
25 – 49 units	Our building has a nice, medium-sized roof deck. The deck has a couple of potted plants, but we have no roof garden. A couple of years ago, the idea of a roof garden was considered, but its initial plan involved people walking on the roof surface, which is not allowed. So the idea was dropped.
25 – 49 units	No. We have rejected proposals to use the rooftop in the past due to objections from top floor owners.

[C Our co-op] has a shared rooftop. We have it noted in our rules, there cannot be
more than 50 people on the roof at one time.
🔀 It looks like the question itself is about rooftop gardens, not simply roof
areas (as in the subject line). We have a public rooftop area, but no garden.
[Our co-op] doesn't have a roof deck or garden, alas.
No, we have leased our rooftop area to cell companies instead.
🛱 We currently do not have a private or public roof area, but we plan to
create one when we replace the roof, which we plan to do within the year.
Roof Gardens are a bad idea in my experience. Not because of the concept,
but because of the repercussions of having the weight and water
containment which can cause roof leaks over time. The day you need to
perform the roof replacement can also pose issues. Unless you can work with
an engineer to account for weight and proper drainage, I would never do a
roof garden. You should also be sure you have a water source such as a
hose bib on the roof. Potted plants on a deck would be as far as I would take
it.
We don't have a roof deck.
🔆 Our co-op has more than 30 private roof terraces and 5 large public
terraces.
[Our co-op] does not have any public roof areas/gardens. [Our co-op] now
has a 'solar farm' on the roof of our [building]. There's very little clear space
as was is not solar, consists of vent fans, a cooling tower and a cell tower &
related equipment.
Would advise any coop considering adding public roof space to consult with
their insurance company first.
