Do you know of someone who has successfully had ironwork, especially on an entrance canopy? Ours is rusting and leaking and needs looking after soon. Any thoughts or help you might be willing to share would be greatly appreciated.

<50 units	We have not done any iron work but one of our residents remembers a firm in Baltimore, D. Krup
<30 units	We've used Dan at North East Iron Works, I think he'd be able to handle a canopy. 529-9440
<50 units	The ironwork on our front canopy was repaired more than twenty years ago and we no longer have information about the contractor. We recently repaired an exterior iron stairway, replaced metal decks and had some fencing repairs, all completed satisfactorily by Brothers Construction. Contact is Willie, 301-335-2727.
<50 units	We got a quote from the Soho Group for some fire escape work, and they seemed to be very knowledgeable. We have not undertaken the project yet, so I can't report as to their performance.
50 – 99 units	[Our co-op] had extensive restoration work done to deteriorating 5-ft-tall iron sconces on either side of our entry porch. We used the G. Krug & Son Ironworks & Museum company based in Baltimore. They repaired rusted sections of metal and replicated and replaced sections that were not salvageable. 100 – 199 units	I use Action Fabricators & Erectors. Marty Pena is great and very reasonable; (301) 322-7600
200+ units	We used Capital Canopies 301-772-7322. They installed our canopy on our roof, metal work and all. They were excellent. https://www.capitalcanopies.com/newpage
200+ units	We have had good results from Action Fabricators in Hyattsville. Mostly security fences and hand railings for us. We deal with Jerry Pena there, and the result has always been as he described.
200+ units	We had the steps redone to [our historic building] on our property last year. The contractor's name is Fred Mashack and his phone number is 202-554-4455.
